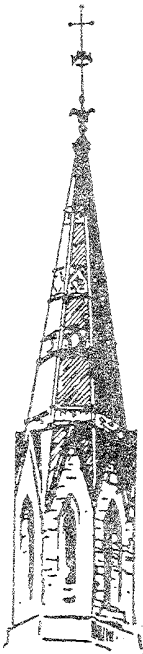

## A Steeple Update

Dear Parishioners,

At its regular meeting on Monday, September 18, the Vestry voted to engage Old Time Restoration, a highly respected steeple reconstruction company from Massachusetts, to rebuild our steeple.

The decision was made with input from the Property Committee and the Steeple Advisory Group. The Old Time Restoration proposal was one of four bids received for the project.

Old Time Restoration will use copper which is coated on both sides with a tin/zinc alloy that weathers to an attractive earth-tone gray for the exterior, and the original finial on the top of the steeple will be restored and replaced. The infrastructure of the steeple will be wood with metal joints. It is our belief that the new steeple will look almost exactly like the old steeple.

Although a final contract has not been signed, our intention to engage Old Time Restoration has been communicated to the company through our architect, David Oakland, AIA, a principal partner at VMDO Architects in Charlottesville. The contract will be reviewed by the finance committee and an attorney before it is signed.

To get the preconstruction work going, metal work in fabricating shingles for our new steeple is under way. Old Time Restoration will begin on-site work on January 4. The work, which is estimated to take four months, will take place in the back driveway and parking areas.

## *From the Rector Search Committee*

Dear Friends in Christ,

Your search committee has been meeting weekly since the month of April. In that time we have met with many of you, heard your concerns and ideas, and taken rector nominations from parishioners. We have also been hard at work completing two crucial documents for the search process: the Parish Profile and the Church Deployment Office (CDO) search form.

You will find the new Parish Profile enclosed. At the suggestion of both Gene Anderson, the diocesan deployment officer, and Bishop Powell, we have prepared a short and effective overview of the parish. Our stated goals and desires are reflective of conversations we have had with parishioners over the past months, and indeed, years. A rector candidate seeking more information about R.E. Lee Church can easily visit the new website and learn about our thriving ministries.

Each Episcopal parish conducting a search must complete a CDO search request form. It is important to know that all clergy complete and continually update parallel forms about themselves. Both parish and clergy forms are stored electronically at the national church. It is through this network that priests and parishes are initially matched. The CDO form is standard and is common to all parishes. Though we struggled to say everything we wanted in the limited space provided, we are certain that we fairly represented R. E. Lee Church in reporting our parish description, goals, and desired rector skills. A computer match has been generated that pulls priests who closely match our desired criteria. The diocese will send letters of inquiry, including the Parish Profile, to these people. All the clergy names submitted by parishioners will also receive this mailing. The names of those interested in being considered for our rector position will be passed on to us.

While the diocese waits to hear from interested priests, we work on. We have just completed an afternoon-long interview training session led by Gene Anderson. We are excited about applying these new skills as we move into the next phase of this rector search: reading and evaluating resumes. From this point forward, our work by necessity becomes extremely confidential. Because the candidates may be currently serving other parishes, we cannot divulge their names during this very important time of discernment.

We trust that you will keep us in your thoughts and prayers as we move forward. We are dedicated to the task at hand and are open to hearing and following the call of this parish and of the Holy Spirit.

## Vestry Elections 2006

The Vestry nomination period is now open to fill five vacancies. Retiring members of the Vestry are Gerry Locher, Susan Cross, Paula Cushman, Melissa Cox, and Jerry Nay.

Nominators may submit up to five candidate names and should obtain the consent of the nominees before doing so.

Nominations may be dropped into the nominations basket in the Narthex on Sundays or mailed to the Parish Office before 5 p.m. Oct. 29 when the nomination period closes.

On Nov. 1, in the absence of a rector, the Senior Warden, in consultation with the treasurer, will establish the ballot. Those persons eligible for election, according to Canon 14, *shall be adult confirmed communicants of the parish, in good standing, who have been worshipers in the parish in the year preceding election and regular contributors to its financial support by pledge, subscription, or some other method by which they shall be known to the treasurer of the parish.*

The December issue of *Cross and Crown*, published the last week in November, and the parish website will include photographs and brief descriptions of the candidates. They will also be posted in the Narthex.

Information on casting an absentee ballot is available in the parish office.

The Vestry election will take place at the Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, Dec. 3, at 9:15 a.m. Election results will be published in the January *Cross & Crown*, on the parish website, and in bulletins.

Nomination forms are also available in the Narthex and the Parish Office.

### Steeple Update Continued

The area behind the "bridge" between the parish house and the church will be closed during the construction period. There will be no parking or traffic in and out of that area during construction and traffic to and from Yellow Brick Road will be rerouted. We will make every effort to accommodate the needs of the parish during the construction period. We will make the elevator in the parish house available to those who need it during the construction period. A formal plan on parking and access during the construction period will be announced in the coming weeks. Our plan is to have a formal dedication of our new steeple this coming May Day.

The parish will receive regular updates on the steeple project via the church bulletin, *Cross & Crown*, and the website. Copies of the contract with Old Time Restoration and drawings of the steeple may be viewed in the parish office as soon as they are completed.

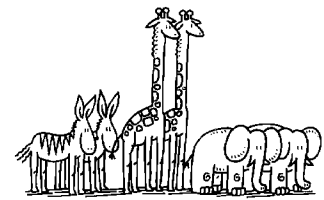
## ***The Music of Taizé***

Music from the Taizé community in France has become increasingly popular in recent years. We have been using this music frequently in our worship services, especially during communion and at the 5:00 service. Many of you have told me you like the contemplative feel of these short, repeated chants.

Usually the Taizé chants use only a few words, expressing a basic reality of faith. As we repeat them, we allow the words to go deeper and deeper into our whole being. Sometimes these songs may stay with us throughout the day.

The music of Taizé is meant to be singable and accessible for everyone. There are also opportunities for solo voices and instruments to enrich the sound – how wonderful to have so many talented musicians in our parish!

**UTO In-Gathering October 22**

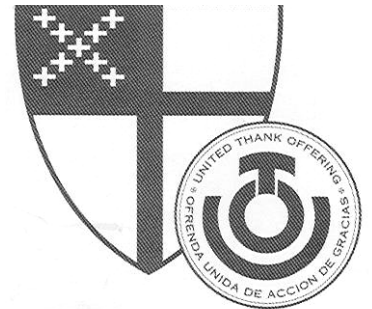
*The mission of the United Thank Offering is to expand the circle of thankful people. To achieve this mission, we encourage daily prayers, offerings, and awareness of the abundance of God's blessings. Every penny of your thank offering goes to support grants for ministries at home and overseas.*

Picture the mid-1880s when Episcopal churchwomen sent boxes of clothing and supplies to missionaries in the field. Offerings at Triennial Meetings of the Women's Auxiliary turned over to the Board of Missions were divided equally between domestic and foreign missions.

In 1889 the first United Offering sent Miss Lisa Lowell as a missionary to Japan and built a new church in Alaska. In 1919 the Women's Auxiliary changed the name to the United Thank Offering, which until 1925 went entirely to women missionaries.

However, in 1967 the thirty-second Triennial Meeting adopted a resolution proposing that the United Thank Offering become a thank offering of and for the *entire* church – that is, men, women and children. It has developed into, not a fund drive to advance only women's causes, but a spiritual discipline in our daily lives in Christ, wherein we offer prayers of thanksgiving for our abundant blessings and put gratitude into action by dropping coins (or bills) into a small blue box as outward and visible signs of our thanks to God.

The UTO is a spiritual and financial partner in the mission work of The Episcopal Church. It seeks to expand the circle of thankful people by encouraging daily prayers, offerings and awareness of the abundance of God's blessings. Furthermore, *every penny* of our thank offering supports annual grants for ministries at home and abroad. In 2006 the UTO funded 112 grants totaling more than \$2.4 million to church or ecumenical projects and programs that meet compelling human needs.



Offerings are "ingathered" twice a year, in spring and fall. Here's what to do: count the coins collected during the past six months. (School children in the family can help.) Then simply write a check for that amount made out to R. E. Lee Memorial Church with UTO on the memo line, place it in the UTO envelope in the bulletin, and drop the envelope into the collection plate on Ingathering Sunday, October 22.

UTO boxes, available in the narthex or parish office, are reusable. Otherwise, a mason jar so labeled will suffice for future offerings collected at the spring 2007 ingathering.

Thank you all for your prayers and offerings in response to God's love as we continue our search for a new rector.
